*“But here at this table, sitting among us as a friend, is the man who will betray me.<sup>22</sup> For it has been determined that the Son of Man must die. But what sorrow awaits the one who betrays him.”*

**B. Self-s** \_\_\_\_\_ .

*“Then they began to argue among themselves about who would be the greatest among them.<sup>25</sup> Jesus told them, “In this world the kings and great men lord it over their people, yet they are called ‘friends of the people.’<sup>26</sup> But among you it will be different. Those who are the greatest among you should take the lowest rank, and the leader should be like a servant.”*

*“Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift each of you like wheat.<sup>32</sup> But I have pleaded in prayer for you, Simon, that your faith should not fail. So when you have repented and turned to me again, strengthen your brothers.”<sup>33</sup> Peter said, “Lord, I am ready to go to prison with you, and even to die with you.”<sup>34</sup> But Jesus said, “Peter, let me tell you something. Before the rooster crows tomorrow morning, you will deny three times that you even know me.”*

*“First, I hear that there are divisions among you when you meet as a church, and to some extent I believe it...<sup>20</sup> When you meet together, you are not really interested in the Lord’s Supper.”*

*“For some of you hurry to eat your own meal without sharing with others. As a result, some go hungry while others get drunk.”*

### 3. Re-focus

**A. Re-** \_\_\_\_\_ .

*“For I pass on to you what I received from the Lord himself. On the night when he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread<sup>24</sup> and gave thanks to God for it. Then he broke it in pieces and said, “This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.”<sup>25</sup> In the same way, he took the cup of wine after supper, saying, “This cup is the new covenant between God and his people—an agreement confirmed with my blood. Do this in remembrance of me as often as you drink it.”*

1 Corinthians 11:23–25 (NLT)

**B. Re-** \_\_\_\_\_ .

*“For every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are announcing the Lord’s death until he comes again.<sup>27</sup> So anyone who eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord unworthily is guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord...<sup>29</sup> For if you eat the bread or drink the cup without honoring the body of Christ, you are eating and drinking God’s judgment upon yourself.<sup>30</sup> That is why many of you are weak and sick and some have even died.”*

1 Corinthians 11:26–27, 29–30 (NLT)

**Re-** \_\_\_\_\_ .

*“That is why you should examine yourself before eating the bread and drinking the cup...if we would examine ourselves, we would not be judged by God in this way.<sup>32</sup> Yet when we are judged by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we will not be condemned along with the world.”*

1 Corinthians 11:28, 31–32 (NLT)
